Flores ask for help to fight dengue

Miami for the fight of the dengue in the country.

Flores said in a press conference that he has looked to contact with Cuban doctors' organizations in Miami with that objective.

El Salvador confronts the *dengue* epidemic in the departments of San Salvador, La Libertad, and Santa Ana, in the central and western regions of the country, where 92 percent of the 1,142 confirmed cases of dengue have been registered by the Health Authorities.

Out of all the cases, eight percent is of the type *hemorraico*, of which 4 children have died this year.

Several mayors have requested to the government to ask the Cuban government for doctors

Flores said that "we recognize that some Cuban doctors can make a contribution, we are looking for organizations in Miami that can come to help us and we would be very happy if they could come here". Under the insistence of journalists, in the sense that the mayors want that collaboration made with Cuba, Flores reiterated that the Cuban doctors resident in Miami are "equally prepared and I believe that they have had the same experience, they are willing to come and I don't see why we should reject them".

The MMTF has being doing humanitarian work during the 1980's, 1990's and continue the help to the need during the first decade of the new Century.

But, not only medical work. The MMTF has been very intense in other disciplines of society such as the arts, the music, publishing and teaching conferences and seminars.

Dengue epidemic in el Salvador

Wednesday, June 12. President Francisco Flores of El Salvador asked for medical help from doctors living in Miami.

The MMT notified the General consul Fernando Quiñones the willingness of our group to help. Immediately the MMT contacted other medical organizations in the area, as well as the Cuban Pediatric Association in Exile, the Children Hospital and the Dade County Medical Association in order to coordinate volunteers to travel to El Salvador.

Also, many civic organizations have been contacted to coordinate the specific donations to obtain and deliver to the areas in need.
